Compliance Contract

In our documentation, we indicate that we desire the students of the Bible School to interact with each other and to be of one heart and one soul. We know that the Holy Spirit must effect this, but we also believe that we must open our hearts and lives to each other. Furthermore, we believe that personal study of the Bible is the most important aspect of the entire training. In summary: “Dedicated to God and His Word, and dedicated to each other”.

Please read this conditions carefully before you sign

1. Every student must confess and believe in Jesus Christ as lord and saviour.

1 Peter 3:15 But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts; and always be ready to give a defence to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear.

Titus 3:4-8 But when the kindness and the love of God our Saviour toward man appeared, not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to His mercy He saved us, through the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Saviour, that having been justified by His grace, we should become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. This is a faithful saying, and these things I want you to affirm constantly, that those who have believed in God should be careful to maintain good works. These things are good and profitable to men.

2. Daily, personal communion with God is essential for attending the Bible school; we ask each participant to make time in the morning together with the Lord.

Ps. 63:2 O God, You are my God! Early will I seek You *in* the morning ; my soul thirsts for You, my flesh longs for You in a dry and thirsty land, without water.

Ps. 88:14 However, I cry out to You, LORD , my prayer meets You in the morning.

Ps. 90:14 Satisfy us in the morning with Your lovingkindness, that we may rejoice and be glad all our days.

Ps. 92:2-4 It is good to praise the LORD and to sing praises to Your Name, O Most High; to declare Your lovingkindness in the morning and Your faithfulness at night, on the ten-stringed lyre and on the lute, with the melody of the harp.

Ps. 143:8 Let me hear Your lovingkindness in the morning, for in You I trust; show me the way I should go, for to You I lift up my soul.

3. In addition to studying the Bible, we also come together for joint prayer to have spiritual fellowship with each other.

1 John 1:3 What we have seen and heard we proclaim to you also, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and in- deed our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ.

4. Everyone is expected to receive mentoring and is encouraged to speak freely and openly about the true condition of his/her heart, as well as about his/her various temptations and struggles. Also, In small groups about his/her condition,(joy, sorrow, struggle, and doubts) in his/her Christian life.

James 5:16 Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much.

Heb. 3:12-13 Beware, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief in departing from the living God; but exhort one another daily, while it is called “Today,” lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin.

5. Everyone is expected to use their gifts for the practical care and well-being of the whole group.

1 Pet. 4:10-11 As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God. If anyone ministers, let him do it as with the ability which God supplies; so that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belong the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen.

1 John 3:17 But whoever has this world's goods, and sees his brother in need, and shuts up his heart from him, how does the love of God abide in him?



6. In the Bible school, everyone is expected to respect and to submit to the leadership of the staff and all of the campus rules.

1 Pet. 2:13a-16 Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human institution (...) as free people, but not using your freedom as a coverup for evil, but as servants of God.

1 Cor. 16:15-16 And I urge you, brothers, you know that the household of Stephanas is the first-fruits of Achaia and that they have devoted themselves to the service of the saints that you also submit to such people, and to everyone who works and labours.

1 Tim. 4:12a and 13a Let no one despise you for your youth (...) Be diligent in reading, in exhortation, in teaching.

7. Every student is asked to avoid discussions about controversial doctrines that can lead to discord and the breaking of fellowship.

1 Cor. 16:14 Let all that you do be done in love

1 Cor. 11:16 But if anyone seems to be contentious, we have no such custom, nor do the churches of God.

1 Tim. 6:3-4 If anyone teaches a different doctrine and does not agree with the sound words of our Lord Jesus Christ and the teaching that accords with godliness, he is puffed up with conceit and understands nothing. He has an unhealthy craving for controversies and quarrels about words. From these come envy, strife, slander, and evil suspicions.

Col. 3:13 Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you.

8. Additionally, every student must be willing to live together with students from different church and national backgrounds.

2 Tim. 2:14 Keep reminding them of these things. Warn them before God against quarrelling about words; it is of no value, and only ruins those who listen.

1 Pet. 1:22 Now that you have purified yourselves by obeying the truth so that you have sincere love for each other, love one another deeply, from the heart.

1 Pet. 4:8 Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins.

9. And finally, we ask for the full acceptance of the Declaration of faith, which is found in the webpage.

1 Pet. 3:15b Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have, but do this with gentleness and respect.

1 John 5:1 Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is born of God, and everyone who loves the father loves his child as well.

I understand that 'TGC' is interdenominational. I have read the Statement of Faith.

I agree with this statement unreservedly. And therefore, in following God's Word, I commit myself to serving others. And to esteem others better than myself. In matters of indifference to be gentle and accommodating, following the example of Romans 15: 2-7: *Therefore let each of us please his neighbour for his good, to build him up. For Christ did not please Himself, but as it is written: The reproaches of those who reproached You fell on Me. For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. And may the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.*
